HOW TO ENTER AT THE PERTH FAIR

THIS YEAR'S THEME - "O CANADA"

*You may only enter one item in each section.

*Fill in the entry form with all the information requested. One entry form per person – additional entry forms are available on the website or at the office.

* **Email**, fax, mail or bring entry form (not your entry) to the fair office before Aug 25th. The Fair office is located on the fairgrounds in the green AGRICON BUILDING. During the month of August someone is usually in the office 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Mon to Fri. **You may put your entries in the mail slot in the door.**

*Tags will be available after August 22nd for those entries received by August 18th and must be **PICKED UP** at the office. **THEY WILL NOT BE MAILED.**

*You must have a tag for each exhibit - it is best to order a tag for every section you think you might enter. If you do not use all of them, that is okay.

*Bring your exhibit with the tag attached to the Homecraft building (crafts, baking & photography) or Agriculture Tent (grain & vegetables) at the fairgrounds on **Thursday, August 30th, between 6:30 p.m. & 9:30 p.m. ONLY.**


*Judging will take place Friday, September 1st, 9:00 a.m - 1:00 p.m.

*You must pick up your entries) on Monday, September 1st between 4:00 & 5:30 p.m. **We will dispose of entries not picked up.**

*Prize money cheques will be mailed to you **AFTER** the fair.

*All exhibits are the responsibility of the exhibitor. Articles must be new work - not shown before!

***Grades are based on the grade you are in while attending school in June 2017, not the grade you are going into in September 2017.**



EARLY BIRD DRAW

SEED & GRAIN

- 402 - 17. Longest cob of corn
- 402 - 18. Tallest corn stalk - cannot include root
- 402 - 19. Tallest soybean plant - cannot include root

LARGE VEGETABLES (15 years & under)

- 501 – 1. Giant Onions, judged by weight.
- 501 – 3. Sunflowers, judged by diameter of head, stem to be cut off at ground level & leaves on lower 3ft removed.
All sunflowers in 501-3 are automatically entered in Sunflower special for Tallest Sunflower.
- 501 – 5. Multi-head sunflower any variety, judged on number of open heads on plant.
- 501 – 6. Zucchini, judged by weight.
- 501 – 8. Beet, judged by weight.
- 501 - 10. Giant Pumpkin, judged by weight. All pumpkin entries become the property of the sponsor for display purposes.
- 501 - 12. Any unusually large vegetable other than current categories, must not be crossed with another variety. Judged by comparing to average vegetable of same variety. Judged on quality, good appearance, & size or weight. (up to Judges discretion). "Exhibitor must be able to provide information on the variety ie: name, family it belongs to etc...."

JUNIOR GARDENERS (15 years & under)

- 601 - 30. Collection of garden vegetables, displayed on or in a container no larger than 24"x 24", judged on quality, number of varieties and arrangement.

Vegetable People

Any combination of just vegetables to create a vegetable person. Must be titled (ie: My Grandpa or My Teacher etc.)

- 601 - 32. 7 years and under
- 601 - 33. 8 to 15 years

- 601 - 34 Garden Scarecrow, best for use in the garden. Not over 7' tall

FLOWERS (15 years & under)

- 701 - 41. **Made in Canada-** An arrangement in a **container from a Canadian made product** (example: honey or maple syrup tin)

BAKING (15 years & under)

- 702 - 42. **White bread, made in a bread machine—1 loaf, attach recipe**
- 702 - 43. **3** Chocolate chip cookies, without nuts **Age 15 & under. Winner agrees to compete at District 2 level Annual Meeting in Oct 2017.** *The winner from our district competes at the O.A.A.S convention in Toronto in February, 2018. 8 cookies are required for these competitions*
702-44 - 702-47 are judged on decorations only.
- 702 - 44. **3** Cookies decorated as "O Canada" - **Age 9 & under**
- 702 - 45. **3** Cookies decorated as "O Canada" - **Age 10 - 15**
- 702 - 46. **3** Cupcakes decorated decorated as "O Canada" - **Age 9 & under**
- 702 - 47. **3** Cupcakes decorated decorated as "O Canada" - **Age 10 - 15**
- 702 - 48. Best lunch box snack - home made squares or bars - **12 YRS & UNDER ONLY**

BOTTLED GOODS (15 years & under)

703 - 47. Strawberry jam (frozen) 250ml jar

703 - 48. Raspberry jam (frozen) 250ml jar

YOUNG HANDICRAFTERS (15 years & under)

705 - 63. Crocheted doll dress - S.Y.A.

705 - 64. Any article made from recycled fabric and cans

705 - 65. Decorate an unopened,, non-perishable box or canned food as a gift for the local food bank (all entries will be donated to the local food bank)

702 - 66. A stuffed toy, sewn together

705 - 67. A crocheted, knitted or sewn cushion cover for your room. You may use all of the techniques to enhance or embellish this project

705 - 68. Any knitted item, not listed in this category—S.Y.A.

705 - 69. Any crocheted item, not listed in this category—S.Y.A.

705 - 70. A puppet made from men's work socks - eyes, nose, ears and tongue sewn on. O Canada theme— example—beaver, fox, rabbit, RCMP horse, groundhog, etc.

JUNIOR HOBBY CRAFTS (15 years & under)

706 - 30. " I made it!" - with duct tape . Ages 10 & under

706 - 31. " I made it!" - with duct tape. Ages 11 - 15

706 - 32. Canadian beaver puppet made from a paper lunch bag

706 - 33. Paint our Canadian flag on a rock for the garden. Rock to be no larger than 6" in any direction.

706 - 34. Wigwam made from natural materials. Not larger than 12" in any direction.

706 - 35. Create an Inukshuk, not larger than 10" in any direction. Ages 10 and under.

706 - 36. Create an Inukshuk, not larger than 10" in any direction.. Ages 11-15.

706 - 37. 'My favourite Canadian Athlete'. On an 8½" X 11" sheet. Include a short paragraph describing the athlete and may include a picture. To be hand printed or handwritten.

JUNIOR PHOTOGRAPHERS (15 years & under)

707 - 12. **Mischief** – Printed pictures can be up to 5"x7" and **MUST** have a 1" (2.5cm) **WHITE** border around the image, using materials such as Bristol board or construction paper.

709 - 13. Any wooden article - 8 years and under

709 - 14. Any wooden article - 9 years to 12 years of age

709 - 15. Any wooden article - 13 years to 16 years of age

JUNIOR DEPARTMENT

PRESCHOOL/KINDERGARTEN

801-1. Draw a picture of your family on a page no larger than 8 1/2" x 11".

801-2. Use your imagination to create an Inukshuk display mounted on a surface no larger than 12" x 12".

801-3. Create a picture of the Canadian flag using your hand stamp as the leaf on a paper no larger than 8 1/2" x 11".

801-4. Using a paper plate, create a beaver mask. Use your imagination to colour and decorate it.

SPECIAL (PRESCHOOL/KINDERGARTEN)

801-5 Penmanship: on a 8 1/2" x 11" piece of paper, print "C" and then "Canada".

GRADES 1 & 2

- 801-6 Using playdough/plasticine, create a hockey rink, no larger than 12" x 12" to mount on.
- 801-7 Use your imagination to create an igloo out of any type of material, display on a mount no larger than 12" x 12".
- 801-8 Draw a picture of something special to Canada on a paper no larger than 8 1/2" x 11".
- 801-9 Make and decorate a pennant flag for Canada Day. Flag should not be any larger than 9" x 12".

SPECIAL (GRADES 1 & 2)

- 801-10 Penmanship: on a 8 1/2" x 11" of paper, print "I Love Canada".

GRADES 3 & 4

- 801-11 Use your imagination to create a Lego display on a mount no larger than 12" x 12" depicting something special to Canada.
- 801-12 Create a picture of Canada's 150 celebration logo on a paper no larger than 12" x 12".
- 801-13 Using playdough/plasticine, create a totem pole no higher than 12", display on a mount no larger than 12" x 12".
- 801-14 Using pictures, create a collage of your favourite Canadian things: (eg. landmarks, places and people, etc.) and display on paper no larger than 12" x 12".

SPECIAL (GRADES 3 & 4)

- 801-15 Penmanship: on a 8 1/2" x 11" of paper, print the names of Canada's 10 provinces and 3 territories.

GRADES 5 & 6

- 801-16 Create a windsock to celebrate Canada Day
- 801-17 Create a mosaic style picture of Canada's 150 official logo using any type of material on a piece of paper no larger than 12" x 12".
- 801-18 Create your own pair of Canada Day flip flops.
- 801-19 Use your imagination to create an original vehicle used in the winter out of Lego, display on a mount no larger than 12" x 12". (Not from a kit)

SPECIAL (GRADES 5 & 6)

- 801-20 Draw a picture of your favourite family trip or outing to somewhere special in Canada on a paper no larger than 8 1/2" x 11".

GRADES 7 & 8

- 801-21 Use your imagination to create a Canadian design using pennies. Glue or mount pennies on a paper/board no larger than 12" x 12".
- 801-22 Create a Canada Day wreath for your door.

SPECIAL (GRADES 7 & 8)

- 801-23 Create a model of a Canadian landmark or important place, display on a mount no larger than 16" x 16".

EXTRA SPECALS

OPEN TO PRESCHOOL, KINDERGARTEN & GRADE 1

- 801-24 A Rice Krispie maple leaf displayed on cardboard no larger than 12" x 12".

OPEN TO GRADES 2, 3, & 4

- 801-25 A Rice Krispie Canadian flag displayed on cardboard no larger than 12" x 12".

OPEN TO GRADES 5, 6, 7, & 8

- 801-26 A Rice Krispie Canada's 150th celebration logo displayed on cardboard no larger than 12" x 12".

POSTER CONTEST

- 802-1 Ages 6 - 8 Create a poster of "Fun in Canada:
- 802-2 Ages 9 - 11 Create a poster of "What to see or do in Canada"
- 802-3 Ages 12-14 Create a poster of "What makes Canada special to me".

Be sure to include a title.

Bristol-board to be cut to 22" x 14".

Majority of the Bristol board should be covered.

Background of the Bristol board does not need to be coloured.
